### All you need...

With the papermaking mould & deckle (1), you can make your very own paper from cellulose fibres (2) and water (3). If you wish, you can also add seeds or flowers (4) and fragrance or dye (5).

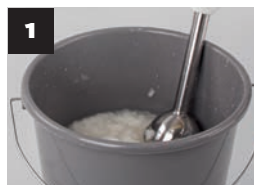


## Papermaking – revival of a forgotten tradition

Become a paper designer! Papermaking is a classical handwork that you can easily handle yourself at home. You don't need much for that. And the whole thing can be a lot of fun. Try it out!

### It's as easy as that:

- 1 Tear cellulose pulp sheets, newspaper or egg carton into pieces, pour hot water over them and mash them – the pulp is ready.
- 2 Add pulp to the water bath – the more it floats in the water, the thicker your paper becomes. Now your creativity is called upon: add some soap dye, fragrance or flowers.
- 3 Dip the papermaking mould & deckle and make your paper.
- 4 Let it dry well out – done!



### The perfect imperfection:

An uneven, jagged paper edge looks particularly natural and is created if you skip the upper window screen frame when dipping.





## Naturally creative

Use your freshly self-made paper like normal paper: you can write on, stamp it or stick labels on it.

### Make your paper grow

For all plant lovers: add seeds to the pulp and let them grow later in the flower pot. To do this, cover your seed paper in the pot with soil – do not forget to water it regularly – be patient and enjoy the floral splendour.





**Why does it always have to be rectangular?**

You can also easily make your very own shapes: press the pulp e.g. with a cookie cutter!

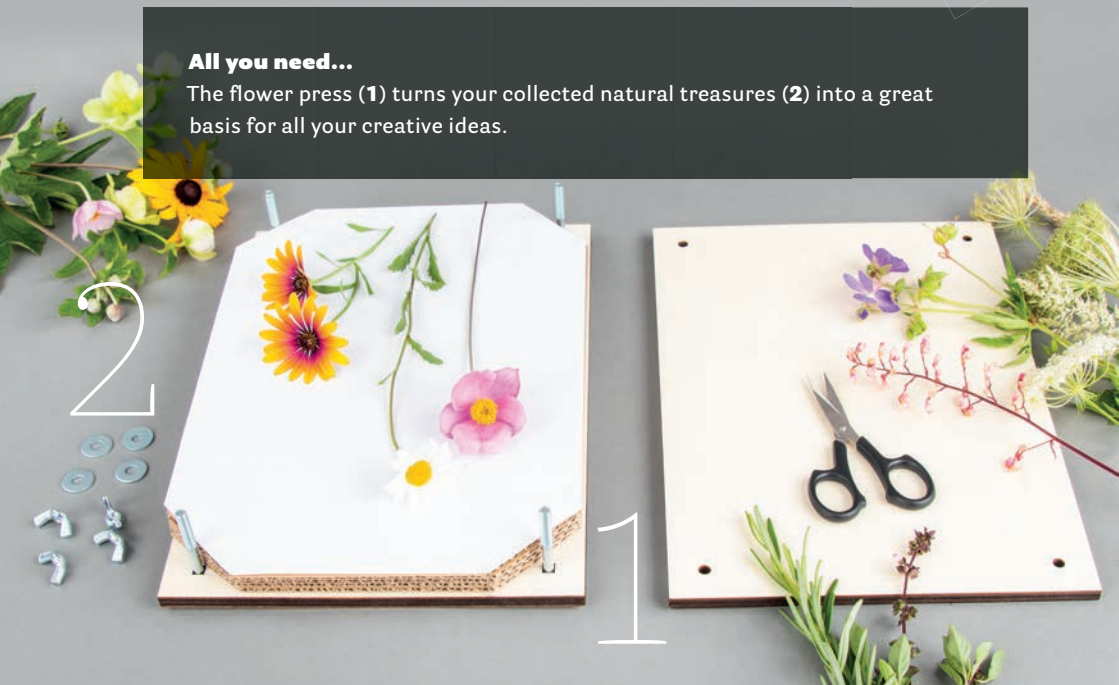
# Pressing flowers – getting floral splendour

Bring nature into your home! Flowers, grass, leaves and herbs – in full bloom, the blaze of colour is astonishing. Would you like to bring this flower magic into your home and preserve it for a long time? Flower pressing is a great technique and is very easy.



## All you need...

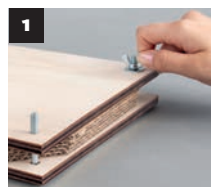
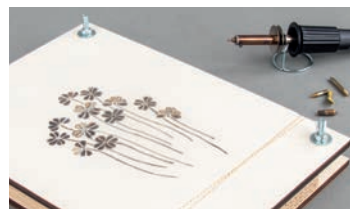
The flower press (1) turns your collected natural treasures (2) into a great basis for all your creative ideas.



## It's as easy as that:

Preparation: let flowers dry well out overnight on a paper towel.

- 1 Lay flowers and blossoms on absorbent paper and screw on single layers securely together in the press.
- 2 Wait for 1 – 2 weeks.
- 3 Open it carefully.



## Tastes differ...

Design your flower press to your own taste, e.g. with our wood-burning pen, making it that way pretty unique.





## Dried flowers – as versatile as your ideas

Your flowers can be further processed creatively: you can display them between panes of glass or stick them on glass jars with decoupage glue.

In combination with epoxy resin, you can get beautiful, unique pieces of jewellery.

No matter for which project are your dried flowers intended, they'll become an eye-catcher for sure!
