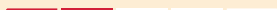

Sustainable without plastics.
Beeswax wrap instead of cling
film.



Used items:

31 634 102 Beeswax pellets, cosmetics quality 20 g

Additionally you need:

89 385 00 Pinking shears
20 cm Cotton fabric, pre-washed
Baking paper
Iron

Instructions:

Cut your pre-washed cotton fabric with pinking shears to the desired size of your beeswax wrap.

Put the cotton fabric on the ironing board aligned with the baking paper.

Spread the beeswax pellets on the cotton fabric. (Fig. 1)
Put another sheet of baking paper over the spread out beeswax pellets.

Now you can iron the beeswax pellets with a hot iron (setting 2) while spreading the liquid wax on the cotton cloth with the iron.

Once you have spread the beeswax evenly over the whole cloth, you can remove the top baking paper and carefully detach the wax cloth.

As soon as the beeswax wrap has cooled down, it is ready for use.

TIP:

First test on a small piece of cloth to see if the colour of the cloth runs when the beeswax pellets are ironed on.

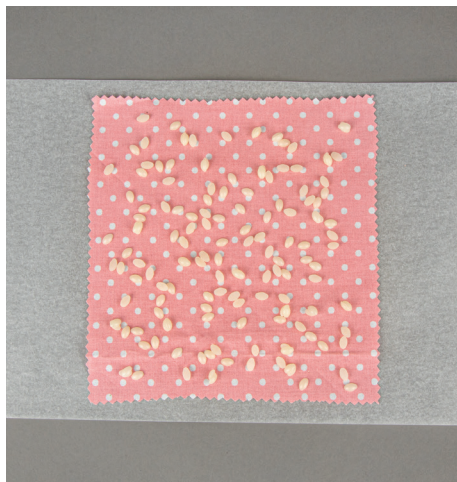
