Cork pouch for the shopping cart chip



Used items:

63 045 546	Rolled cork fabric - mocha	6 cm × 14 cm
or		
63 045 454	Rolled cork fabric - artichoke	6 cm × 14 cm
or		
63 045 504	Rolled cork fabric - sand	6 cm × 14 cm
21 195 21	Key ring platinum	1 piece
53 874 607	Push-button, 15mm ø old silver	1 piece
or		
53 874 619	Push-button, 15mm ø old gold	1 piece
53 564 407	Cotton yarn "Stitch & Knot" blue-green	1 m
or		
53 564 536	Cotton yarn "Stitch & Knot" hazelnut	1 m
30 071 000	Extra strong double-sided adhesive tape	12 cm

Additionally you need:

89 537 00	Fabric shears
53 875 999	Pins
69 067 000	Blunt embroidery needle
22 599 000	Expert hole punch with 6 punches
38 369 01	Permanent foil pen
	Cardboard for stencil (see illustration)
	Hammer
	Support for push-button (wood)



Instructions:

- Place the cut-to-size sheet as following:
63 045 ... Cork as cutting pattern and 1 × 2 cm × 5 cm
63 016 000 Cork as cutting pattern
- Place the two cork cuttings for the cork pouches left sides together and fix them centrally with the double-sided adhesive tape. Fasten the lower push-button at the lower part of the pouch (as described in the instructions for push-buttons).
- As a tab, fold the small cork cutting left sides together 2 cm × 5 cm centric over the length and fix it somehow with the double-sided adhesive tape (this will be later on the fastening for the key ring). Fold the lower part of the pouch, put the tab between the right lateral seam of the pouch and fix those with a few pins.
- Prepare a stencil with a cutting pattern out of a cardboard. Draw the punch holes on your pouch by using the permanent foil pen and the stencil and punch it with the expert hole punch out.
- Close the pouch by a simple backstitch. By starting at the right lower side of the pouch across the flap up to the left lower side of the pouch and then back again.
- Now fasten (as described in the instructions for the push-button) the upper push-button at the flap of the pouch.
