



**HANDICRAFT TIP**

GB

For hanging floral beauties.  
Knot plant pot hanging planters  
with macramé yarn.



## Used items:

### Macramé hanging planter, cream

<b>44 000 505</b>	Macramé yarn set, 2.2 mm ø, natural	30 m
<b>22 333 21</b>	Key ring, 30 mm ø, platinum	1 piece

### Additionally you need:

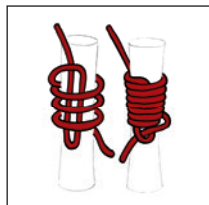
<b>89 378 00</b>	Craft scissors
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## Instruction:

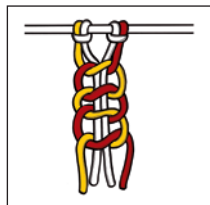
- 1 Cut the yarns as follows:  
4× 3.0 m  
4× 3.5 m  
2× 1.5 m
- 2 Lay the yarn threads measuring 4× 3.5 m and 4× 3.0 m half of each across the ring. Then gather all the yarn threads together and wind the yarn thread of 1.5 m around them to form a 4 cm long gathering knot (see picture Gathering Knot).
- 3 Now divide the yarn threads into four strands, taking 2× 3.0 m (= conductive yarn) and 2× 3.5 m (rug yarn) per strand.
- 4 Start knotting after 10 cm and make 45 spiral knots per strand (see picture Spiral Knot).
- 5 Now divide the strands into 2 yarn threads each (1× conductive yarn and 1× rug yarn) and put them together. Then make a weaver knot after every 15 cm (see picture Weaver's Knot).
- 6 Divide the strands again into 2 yarn threads each (1× conductive yarn and 1× rug yarn) and put them together. Make a weaver's knot after every 8 cm (see picture Weaver's Knot).
- 7 Then gather all the yarn threads together aligned flush and after another 20 cm wind them with the second yarn thread of 1.5 m to form a 4 cm long gathering knot (see picture Gathering Knot).
- 8 Cut the yarn threads to the desired length (herein 25 cm) and unravel them individually.



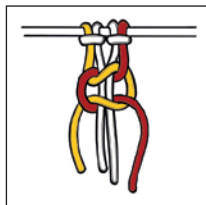
Gathering knot



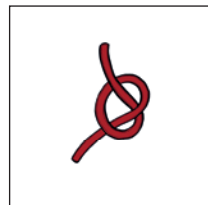
Spiral knot

### Macramé hanging planter, brown

<b>44 000 505</b>	Macramé yarn set, 2.2 mm ø, natural	33 m
<b>62 731 000</b>	Wooden tray, FSC Mix Credit, 30 cm ø	1 piece
<b>62 500 00/</b>		
<b>64 018 00</b>	Raw wood ring, 5.5 cm ø	1 piece
<b>62 504 00</b>	Raw-wood balls, drilled, 12 mm ø	16 pieces
<b>62 506 00</b>	Raw-wood balls, drilled, 18 mm ø	4 pieces
<b>62 508 00</b>	Raw-wood balls, drilled, 23 mm ø	8 pieces
<b>62 510 00</b>	Raw-wood balls, drilled, 30 mm ø	4 pieces

### Additionally you need:

<b>89 378 00</b>	Craft scissors
<b>69 067 000</b>	Embroidery needle, blunt

## Instruction:

### 1 Cut the yarns as follows:

- 4× 4.0 m
- 4× 3.5 m
- 2× 1.5 m

**2** Lay the yarn strands measuring 4× 3.5 m and 4× 3.0 m half of each across the ring. Then gather all the yarn threads together and wind the yarn thread of 1.5 m around them to form a 4 cm long gathering knot (see picture Gathering Knot).

**3** Now divide the yarn threads into four strands, taking 2× 3.0 m (= conductive yarn) and 2× 3.5 m (rug yarn) per strand.

**4** Start knotting after 40 cm and make 2 spiral knots per strand (see picture Spiral Knot) and thread one raw wood ball (18 mm ø) per strand onto both conductive yarns.

**5** Then make 13 spiral knots in each skein (see picture Spiral Knot) and thread one raw wood ball (23 mm ø) per strand onto both conductive yarns.

**6** Then make next 17 spiral knots per strand (see picture Spiral Knot) and thread a raw wood ball (30 mm ø) per strand onto both conductive yarns and make a weaver's knot under each raw wood ball. After another 3 cm, make a weaver's knot again and thread one raw wood ball (23 mm ø) per strand onto both conductive yarns and make a weaver's knot under each raw wood ball (see picture Weaver's Knot).

**7** Then gather all the yarn threads together aligned flush and after another 20 cm wind them with the second yarn thread of 1.5 m to form a 4 cm long gathering knot (see picture Gathering Knot).

**8** Cut the yarn threads to the desired length (herein 25 cm). Now thread one raw wood ball (12 mm ø) onto each yarn thread and fix them at different heights, with an overhand knot (see picture overhand knot). Then unravel the yarn threads individually.

**TIP:** You can also paint the raw wood balls into matching colours.
