35058999 Egg dye set with 5 colours
60822000 H2O-paintbrush
38798000 PET spray bottle, transparent 50 ml
$\mathbf{3 8 4 3 4 0 0}$ Sponge stamps
$\mathbf{8 9} \mathbf{2 4 1 0 0}$ Precision craft cutter, 14 cm
Additionally you need:
Fresh hen's eggs (preferably light-coloured), bowl, tablespoon, vinegar, cooking oil


## Instruction:

## Basic "egg dyeing" instructions:

Put the hen's eggs in the water for cooking, dissolve the chosen egg dye in 125 ml of hot water and add a tablespoon of vinegar. Put the warm eggs in the dye solution for about 3-4 minutes. Let them dry on paper towel. Oil them (with e.g. cooking oil) to get a beautiful shine. The dye is suitable for brown as well as white eggs, but the resulting colour shades may differ.
Each colour is sufficient for about $6-8$ eggs (depending on the egg size).

## Creative egg-dyeing techniques:

Please note the following: For any applied technique - except the scratch painting technique - it is important that the hen's egg is freshly cooked and still warm. The dye should also be warm when processing, so that the dye can better permeate the eggshell.

1 Dipping: Stir two different dye colours in one glass each and dip the egg halfway into one of the two colours for a few minutes. Allow to dry for a few seconds and then turn the egg over and dip its other half into the other colour. The colours can also be partially immersed/dipped one upon the other. Drip off the painted egg on a kitchen paper and let it dry.

2 Spraying: Pour the already mixed dye into the spray bottle and spray onto the egg to your liking (from a distance of about $15-20 \mathrm{~cm}$ ). We recommend that you test the spraying on a paper first.

3 Dabbing: Stir the dye vigourously (more concentrated, using less water than usual) to achieve a beautiful, intense colour result when using the dabbing method. Soak up the dye with the small sponge stamp and set carefully the dots (allow dots to dry before turning the egg).

4 Writing on: Stir the dye vigourously (more concentrated, using less water than usual), fill the H 2 O pen with it and decorate or write on the egg as desired.

5 Scratch painting technique: Dye the hen's egg according to the basic instructions and let it dry well out. Create the motif by incising the craft knife (carefully and precisely with slight pressure) into the surface of the coloured egg to reveal a lighter coloured layer underneath (white eggshell).

Additionally you need:
Transfer paper, pointed-tip paper scissors, pencil or ballpoint pen

## Instructions:

1 Cut the two rectangular flaps of the folding box along the fold line by means of the paper scissors.

2 Copy both sides of the template sheet and cut out the ears and the face on the square-shaped outer sides of the copy.

3 Lay the transfer paper with the black side facing down on the front of the folding box. Place the chosen bunny face in the middle and trace its outlines with a pencil or ballpoint pen. Do the same when transferring the bunny ears on the inside of the opposite lid.

4 Draw the eyes, muzzle and whiskers using the Multi-Liner.

5 Cut out the ears along the outlines with the pointed-tip paper scissors and fold the box together.

TIP: The eyes look particularly lively if you use the white acrylic marker to create a tiny dot of light.

Now you can fill your Easter nest as you please and offer a bit of joy!
