Additionally you need:

33 487 000 Glue fix pen

30 071 000 Double-sided adhesive tape, extra strong Mixing vessel, possibly sandpaper, scissors, paintbrush, sharp needle or

tweezers



- 1 Put the placeholder at the desired spot in your casting mould and affix it by means of the double-sided adhesive tape.
- 2 Mix the white Raysin casting powder with water according to the instructions given and fill the casting moulds with the resulting casting compound.
- 3 After about 240 minutes drying time, demould the large bunny and the small one after about 180 minutes drying time, then remove the placeholder. To do this, use a sharp needle or tweezers.
- 4 If necessary, sand the edges with sandpaper.
- 5 Paint the two hollows of the little bunny, the wooden egg and the veneer wood egg, then allow them to dry well out.

Make a wreath using small paper roses and organza ribbon. Hang the finished crown on one of the big bunny's ears. Glue the decorative quail egg to the bottom of the hole by means of the glue fix pen.

- 6 Cut one piece of ribbon (from the ribbon & cord set) measuring 30 cm and another one of 25 cm, then tie one bow around the ear and another one around the waist of one of the small bunnies.
- 7 To cap it all off, glue decoratively the wooden egg, the veneer wood egg and the small paper roses in/on the bunnies.
















The dream team draws ever closer

into the space reached by the placeholder. Eggs in bunnies? Bunnies in eggs? Eggs in eggs? Bunny in the bunnies? The possibilities are virtually endless. Paper flowers and colourful ribbons bring an additional splash of colour.
