Self-cast in a jiffy. Ribbed
candles stylishly displayed.

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Used items:

36 201 000	Casting mould Ribbed candle, twisted	1 piece
46 801 502	Decorative metal tray, ø 20 + 25 cm, eucalyptus	1 piece
31 042 02	Wax pellets, white	570 g
31 640 685	Colour pigments for wax, pastel	1 piece
85 493 000	Eucalyptus bundle with paper sleeve	1/3 bundle
31 589 000	Flat wick, FD19	60 cm

Additionally you need:

Stove, candle wax melter, scissors, cotton darning needle

Instructions:

1 Take the cotton darning needle to pierce a small hole in the middle of the bottom of the silicone casting mould and pull the wick through the resulting hole. Then lay the mould flat on a stable surface.

2 Place the metal wick holder over the opening of the casting mould and insert the other end of the wick into the hole of the wick holder.

3 Melt about 190 g of wax pellets per candle in a bain-marie (Prior to this, please carefully follow the instructions for melting wax, as there is a risk of burns!).

TIP To dye the candle, add the colour pigment to the melted wax and mix well. Carefully pour the liquid wax into the mould.

TIP The mould can be filled to different height levels.

4 Let it cool down thoroughly - A sinkhole may occur while cooling down, which can be evened out by pouring in more wax. Allow the wax to cure fully. Take out the wick from the holder and carefully remove the silicone casting mould.

5 Place the demoulded candles on the metal tray and decorate with a few sprigs of eucalyptus.



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
