Round light-pink soap with cream rosette

## Used items:

Soap
34231000 Soap casting mould: Round, round \& small 40 mm
34228000 Creative-soap ..... 41 g
34246313 Soap-colour, purple
34222000 Bath salt
Cream rosette
34223000 Kneading-soap
89799000 Pastry bag with 4 tips
Cookie cutter34228000 Creative-soap34246532 Soap-colour, nougat6109800 Wooden skewer, 3 mm ø
Additionally you need:


## Cream rosette

8 Mix the kneading-soap with hot water and the cooking oil -50 g of the kneading-soap with 20 ml of hot water and about 5 ml of the cooking oil.

9 Stir this mixture with a craft stick and let it rest for 10 minutes.

10 Then knead the mixture well again.

11 Build together a pastry bag (without a bag) and fill it with some kneading-soap.

12 Push the kneading-soap with a finger through the tip and shape at once the pushed out mixture.

## Cookie cutter

13 Melt the creative-soap in a water-bath on the stove
(max. $60^{\circ}$ - do not boil).

14 After the complete melting, you can stir the colour in the liquid soap. Therefore, use a wooden spatula or a teaspoon. Pour it dropwise.

15 Pour the melted soap onto a flat surface such as a small lid or some aluminum foil.

16 Once the soap hardened, after at least half an hour, you can cut the desired motifs out by means of the cookie cutters.

## Additional info and tools

The soap dries or rather carries on ripening and becomes thereby firmer (two up to three weeks). Depending on the temperature and airiness, the soap can perspire. We recommend therefore to wrap the soap after its demoulding in a cellophane foil. Clean the soap casting mould and the pots with hot water.

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
