

Who wants to watch diligent craftsmen? Workbench made from wood craft sticks for gnomes.

## Used items:

| $\mathbf{6 1 2 1 7 3 1}$ | Wooden craft sticks | approx. 15 pieces |
| :--- | :--- | ---: |
| $\mathbf{4 6 5 9 8 \mathbf { 2 8 2 }}$ | Christmas wreath miniatures | 1 piece |
| $\mathbf{8 6 2 5 7 \mathbf { 0 0 }}$ | Metallic/wooden tools | 1 bag |
| $\mathbf{6 6 \mathbf { 0 7 5 ~ 4 4 4 }}$ | Decorative fir trees, snow-covered | 2 pieces |
| $\mathbf{8 8 \mathbf { 8 1 5 ~ 0 0 }}$ | Decorative broom, 9.5 cm | 1 piece |
| $\mathbf{3 3 \mathbf { 4 0 7 0 0 }}$ | Craft glue |  |
| $\mathbf{3 9 5 7 9 1 0 2}$ | Decorative snowflakes, white |  |

## Instruction:

1 Cut a wooden stick into three pieces (each of about 3.7 cm ) for the tabletop. Position four wooden sticks precisely adjacent each other and glue the three cut-out pieces, spaced out evenly, across over. Let them dry out. Then stick a wood cover to the front and back side.

2 Divide two wooden sticks in the middle $(5.5 \mathrm{~cm})$ and glue them equallyspaced as workbench legs.

3 After drying, attach another wooden stick lengthwise and centrally on each side of the legs.

4 Finally, cut a total of four long sticks ( 4.5 cm ) from two more wooden sticks and glue them on as a shelf.

Have a lot of fun with the designing of your workbench, so your gnome can start working straightaway.
